



# GEORGIA

## 2024 Annual Observance Report of the Special Data Dissemination Standard

### I. INTRODUCTION

1. The IMF Data Standards Initiatives promote the dissemination of timely and comprehensive statistics, contributing to the formulation of sound macroeconomic policies and the efficient functioning of financial markets. The Initiatives comprise three tiers: the Enhanced General Data Dissemination System (e-GDDS), Special Data Dissemination Standard (SDDS), and SDDS Plus. 2. Georgia subscribed to the SDDS on May 17, 2010, and met all the SDDS requirements at the time of subscription.
3. This report covers observance of the SDDS undertakings by Georgia in 2024, in the four dimensions of the SDDS, as set forth in the [SDDS legal text](#): **access by the public**—availability of a National Summary Data Page (NSDP) and Advance Release Calendar (ARC); **data coverage, periodicity, and timeliness; integrity of the disseminated data**—metadata certification; and **quality of the disseminated data**. The SDDS requires public dissemination of data on the DSBB, including the metadata, the ARC, and a link to the NSDP.
4. IMF staff regularly monitors the observance by subscribers of the SDDS requirements to determine whether any deviations arise, in which case, staff will assess them and determine the nature and extent of the deviation. Serious deviations from the SDDS undertakings will be addressed in accordance with the nonobservance procedures as set forth in Section III.4 of the SDDS legal text.

### II. SDDS UNDERTAKINGS

5. The [Summary of Observance](#) table on the DSBB shows Georgia's dissemination policy concerning periodicity and timeliness of the SDDS-prescribed data categories and their components as well as the flexibility options allowed under the SDDS that it has exercised, if any.

#### A. Access by the public

6. Georgia displayed the SDDS-prescribed components on its [NSDP](#) and/or showed them via hyperlinks on national webpages. Georgia posted on the NSDP the reference period of linked tables for the Data Template on International Reserves and Foreign Currency Liquidity, External Debt, and International Investment Position.
7. Georgia met the SDDS requirements for disseminating an ARC for all data categories.

## B. Data

### Coverage

8. Georgia took no “as relevant” coverage flexibility options.
9. Georgia met the SDDS requirements for coverage for all data categories.

### Periodicity: frequency of data compilation (annual, quarterly, etc.)

10. **Commitments under the SDDS.** As shown in Georgia's [Summary of Observance](#) table:
  - 10.a. Georgia used flexibility options for periodicity on the following:
    - Production index
    - Labor market: Employment
    - Labor market: Unemployment
  - 10.b. Georgia's national or committed periodicity does not exceed the SDDS requirement for any data category.
11. **Performance under the SDDS** (Table 1). Georgia's data disseminations met the SDDS periodicity requirements for all data categories.

### Timeliness: difference between the end of a reference period and the date of data dissemination

12. **Commitments under the SDDS.** As shown in Georgia's [Summary of Observance](#) table:
  - 12.a. Georgia used flexibility options for timeliness on the following:
    - Production index
    - Labor market: Employment
    - Labor market: Unemployment
  - 12.b. Georgia's national or committed timeliness exceeds (i.e., is shorter than) the one prescribed by the SDDS for:
    - National accounts
    - Labor market: Employment
    - Labor market: Unemployment
    - Labor market: Wages/Earnings
    - Price index: Consumer prices
    - Price index: Producer prices
    - General Government Operations
    - Central government debt
    - Depository corporations survey
    - Central bank survey
    - Reserves template
    - Merchandise trade

13. **Performance under the SDDS** (Table 1). Georgia's data disseminations met the SDDS requirements for timeliness for all data categories.

#### **Punctuality: difference between the ARC date and the date of data dissemination**

14. Georgia's data dissemination was punctual against its ARC for all data categories. (Table 2).

#### **C. Integrity of the disseminated data**

15. Georgia did not meet the SDDS requirement for an annual certification of the accuracy of the metadata posted on the DSBB within one month after the end of 2024 (Table 3).

#### **D. Quality of the disseminated data**

16. Georgia provided available information on the methodology, sources, and reconciliation of data categories in the Data Quality Assessment Framework that would facilitate data quality assessment by data users.
17. Georgia has received a mission to produce a Data module of the Reports on Observance of Standards and Codes (data ROSC) through which the IMF assesses in detail the quality of the statistical systems of member countries. The ROSC reports can be accessed [here](#).
18. The Data Issues Annex of the Article IV Consultation Staff Report of May 2024 ([Georgia: 2024 Article IV Consultation-Press Release; Staff Report; and Statement by the Executive Director for Georgia](#)) stated that the data provided to the Fund is adequate for surveillance.
